For Everyone

We ask all worshippers—both members and guests—to help us to be a friendly church by signing the Worship Register kept near the center aisle in each pew. The registers are usually signed while the offering is gathered. After you sign it, please pass it to the others in your pew for them to sign.

Assistive Listening Devices are available to those who may experience hearing deficiencies. Speak with an usher and they will get you a sound enhancer for the service.

Restrooms are located down the hallway toward the office end of the building. As you exit the church sanctuary, turn to your left, and walk down the hallway to access the restrooms.

For Families

We love having children be a part of our worship services! The first Sunday of each month has a children's devotion and an alternate order of service. If you need a place to take a fussy child during the worship service, the Gathering Place is located right next to the church sanctuary. As you exit the sanctuary, turn left and you will find the Gathering Place. There is a speaker system as well so you can follow along with the service.

Holy Communion—The Lord's Supper

St. James practices *member communion*. We welcome those who are members of St. James, or one of our sister churches in the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) or the Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS) to join us for the Lord's Supper. If you are not yet a member of St. James or another WELS or ELS church, please speak with Pastor Marquardt.

St. James has gluten-free communion wafers available for any members who need them. For more information, please speak with Pastor Marquardt.

Offerings

God tells us that when we give, we should do so thoughtfully (see 1 Corinthians 16:2), cheerfully (see 2 Corinthians 9:6-8), and generously (see Luke 6:38). SCRIPTURE READING

The Ascension of Our Lord
A harmony of Matthew, Mark, and Luke
and the Acts of the Apostles

In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God.

Soon after the resurrection, the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

On one occasion, Jesus said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.

On another occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

When Jesus had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. And he sat at the right hand of God. They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

Then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy from the hill called the Mount of Olives, a Sabbath day's walk from the city. And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God.
